
CHALLENGES (EARLY 2000s)

Waste was not segregated at source. Collection of recyclables was largely left to the informal sector. Used cartons were not seen as a separate grade.



READING THE SIGNS EARLY

Anticipating the growth in demand for safe and hygienic food in Tetra Pak cartons, we initiated collection and recycling network for used cartons byidentifying and connecting everyone in the value chain - recyclers, NGOs, waste collectors, retailers, customers, and consumers

Partnership with Channel 3 TV program 208 tons or 21,000,000 used cartons collected in 2008 416,000 school notebooks, 6,240 sets of classroom desks and chairs donated to Border Patrol Police schools



Green Roof Project for Friends in Need (of "Pa") Volunteers Foundation

Partnership with the Foundation, Big C, and TV 360 degree : 2,000 tons or 200,000,000 used cartons collected and over 60,000 roof sheets donated to support those in need more than 20 provinces since 2010



Beverage Carton Recycling Project (BECARE):

Partnership with industry peers and local government 1,770 tons or 177,000,000 used cartons collected since 2016 in 13 provinces
